# **Registration and Fee**

There will be no meals provided; units will cook all meals in their Campsite. To earn the Camporee Patch included in the fee a Scout must participate in all 3 Activities, visit the Show and Do, attend both Campfires and attend 1 of 3 Worship Services. There will be a Camporee Trading post that will have Hot dogs and snacks available throughout the day.

# **Camping**

There will be camping for Boy Scout Troops Friday and Saturday evenings in their assigned Camping areas. We ask that Troops use propane stoves for cooking as much as possible. A Troop may bring firewood to use, but it must be taken home at the conclusion of the Camporee. When building a fire remove and save the sod and replace it when you leave the Camporee.

Every participant adult and youth needs to have a copy of a Class 1 medical form to present at registration. Please make a copy for your records, as no forms will be returned. A trained Medical staff will be on site of the Camporee to handle Medical emergencies. .
