WESTMORELAND-FAYETTE COUNCIL COUNCIL CAMPOREE MAY 17-19, 2024

LEADER'S GUIDE

INTRODUCTION:

The 2024 Westmoreland-Fayette Council Camporee will serve as the kick-off to the Camp Conestoga 75th Anniversary Celebration. The patrol-based competition will take place May 17-19, 2024. This event will consist of more than 100+events for scouts and scouters, an alumni reception, cub scouting activities and historical programs for campers and visitors. This is only the first of many events or activities celebrating 75 summers of operation at Camp Conestoga and additional programs will take place during the resident camp weeks beginning in June of 2024.

CAMPOREE BASIS:

- The cost of the event for participants is \$10.
 (This includes event patch and program materials.)
- All scouts will camp with their troops in an assigned area. Scouts must provide their own tents, cooking gear, ax yard, equipment, etc.
- Troops will cook their meals in their camp sites during scheduled times. Food will not be

- provided by the camporee and must be planned for and purchased before the event.
- Adult leaders are welcome to help staff the various program areas but must sign up prior to the event. Volunteering in program areas is separate from "The Event Staff" and will not receive the same recognition items.

- Registration closes April 19th, 2024.
- The event will open on Friday May 17th at 5:00PM. Troops and campers may arrive and check in at the health lodge all evening.
- All participants must have a BSA Health Form with Parts A & B filled out.
- The opening campfire at 9:00PM will address the competition, scoring, activities and rules of the weekend.
- The Patrol Leader's Council (PLC) will occur at 10:00PM. Points will begin to be accumulated starting at this meeting.
- At the PLC, all patrols leaders (one per patrol) will receive their activity manual. This will also serve as their patrols scoring sheets throughout the event.

- All scoring sheets need to be removed from the activity manual and turned in a designated location (listed on each scoring sheet).
- No additional scoring sheets or activity manuals will be issued after the PLC. Any patrol that loses or destroys their activity manual will be eliminated from the overall competition.
- All activities will either be listed during an assigned "activity block" or as an "all-day activity". An "activity block" is a scheduled 90minute time period. "All-day activities" must have their scoring sheets turned in by 5:30PM on Saturday.
- All scoring will be calculated by the analytics staff and posted periodically throughout the weekend. All final scoring will be subject to approval by the event chairman. Any misconduct by the patrol, subversion of rules, expectations or the scout oath and law; or falsifying of score sheets will the patrol being eliminated from competition.
- A patrol shall include at least 5 (five) members but no more than 8 (eight) members. If a troop cannot field a complete patrol (of at least 5 scouts) scouts from two or more troops

- may be assigned to compete as a singular patrol for competition. The scouts will still eat and sleep with their home troops.
- Any Scouts BSA female troops or patrols that do not meet the minimum patrol numbers, may be merged into or with patrols with boys from Scouts BSA.
- Any Venturing, Sea Scouts, Varsity or Exploring units competing must also assign their members to patrols for the competition.
- All participants must be under 18 years of the entirety of the competition.
- In order for a scout to win the "Grand Prize" as defined as "a free week at Camp Conestoga" a scout must be under 18 at the council camporee, be a member of the highest scoring patrol & be under 18 years of age and be registered as a "youth participant" at Camp Conestoga in 2024.
- If the scout turns 18 years of age before attending summer camp or opts not to attend Camp Conestoga during the 2024 summer camp season, they will forfeit their "Grand Prize" but will still be honored as one of the winning patrol members at future events.

Program Activities

Before the Event: (10 Points Each Per Patrol)

- Swim Tests: For aquatic activities, scouts must have a completed swim test before the event. (This can be submitted by your troop leader at registration.)
- Create a Patrol Logo
 - This can be hand drawn or created digitally. It must be submitted to the event chairman before the event or at the PLC – Friday Evening.
- Create a Patrol Flag
 - This must be a physical flag. It can be made of cloth, leather or fabric. It must be at least 18" x 12". It will need to be carried throughout the event by the patrol. It must be present at the PLC – Friday Evening.
- Create a Promotional Item or Flyer for the Event
 - This physical or digital promotional item must be launched before the event and evidence of its publishing or posting will need to be indicated to the event chairman)

Due at the Patrol Leader's Council Meeting (10 Points Per Patrol)

Duty Roster

- Complete the Duty Roster in the Activity Manual.
- This will serve as a list of camp site duties during the event.

Patrol Schedule

- Complete the Patrol Schedule in the Activity Manual
- This will serve as a guide for members of patrol to complete the maximum number of activities during each block. Some activities may not be completed, and no points will be award to a patrol for any events that do not attend.
- Patrol Photo with Local Civic Leader or First Responder
 - Prior to the Event, the patrol should meet one local civic leader or first responder and take a group photo with them. This photo will be added to the event photo collection. Please be sure to identify the local civic leader or first responder in the photo.

- Complete the Fitness Plan in the Activity Manual.
- o This will be a guide to healthy activity at the event.

occur and score sheets will be collected by the appropriate staff member and turned into the camp office. Any patrols waiting to begin an activity but have yet to begin by the end of the 90-minute period will forfeit their chance to accumulate any points for that specific activity.

Adult Programs

A list of adult programs will be announced at the PLC meeting on Friday evening at the event. Any adult wishing to volunteer to help score, staff or support a program area will also have the ability to sign up at registration or at the PLC meeting. We are asking the adults help to supervise the campsite, cooking and preparation during this event so the youth can maximize their time during the competition.

Cub Scout Programs

A Cub Scout Program will allow the youth to participate in a program area near the lake. The Cub Scouts and their families may also enjoy watching the competition, visiting the museum, stopping in at the trading post or visiting in the alumni area. The cost for Cub Scouts and their parents is \$10 per person and will be counted as "Alumni/Day Pass". No overnight camping is permitted for Cub Scouts and their program will run from 1:00PM – 5:30PM.

75th Anniversary Staff

The event staff will be directed by Tom Price. Ken Hager will serve as the camp staff moral officer during the event. Paul Rock will act as the Camp Director and Kenny Bartlett will serve as the NCAP Standard Camp Master. Any and all issues can be addressed to one of these four staff members.

Event staff members will be fed in the dining hall during meals and be issued the official staff shirt to be worn throughout the activity blocks.

Class A or Field Uniform Policy

All campers, leaders and staff are expected to wear their Class A or Field Uniform during the opening campfire, evening flag ceremony and the closing camp fire. The uniform is to be worn per BSA regulations and should be in a clean, presentable fashion. Individual troop hats, neckerchiefs or other approved accessories are permitted.

While wearing the uniform, BSA pants, skirts or shorts, jean shorts or pants (without holes, rips, paint or designs) or other solid color cloth shorts or pants may be worn. No swimsuits or printed pants should be worn with the scouting uniform. OA Sashes, Merit Badge Sashes, Awards, Ribbons or other devices do not need to be worn during the event.

For the "Uniform Inspection" activity, visit the main office in uniform at some point between 9:00AM – 5:30PM to receive your inspection. All members of the patrol must be incompliance with the score sheet to receive maximum points.

Anyone wishing to produce shirts, flags or items bearing the logos of the Camp Conestoga 75th Anniversary must adhere to the following guidelines. Any patrols or units found to be in violation of the branding guide will be disqualified from placing or winning the overall event but may still participate.
