Fees and Regulations:

- 1. There is \$1.00 PER PERSON FEE for Westmoreland-Fayette Council or District Events Applications are to be submitted at least two weeks prior to requested camp-out.
- 2. Camp Conestoga / Buck Run are not available for rental on OA weekends.
- 3. All units should assume that the shower houses in Conestoga/Buck Run will be closed (winterized, no water) between October and May.
- 4. Non-Scout Organizations and Out of Council Districts must submit a certificate of insurance with the application.
- 5. Out of Council or Non-Scouting Organizations will be charged at a rate of \$2.00 per person to use the Camps for activities/events. A \$50.00 non-refundable deposit is required with the application and will be deducted from the total cost of the activity/event. A final bill will be sent after the event after final attendance has been determined.
- 6. IN-COUNCIL DISCOUNT- Unit will receive \$10.00 discount on second or more use of Camp Facilities

CAMP USE POLICIES

- 1. Everyone using the camp is expected to conduct themselves according to the Scout oath and law.
- 2. Each group must have one adult leader who is 21 or over and a second adult who is at least 18.
- 3. For co-ed groups both the male and female leadership must be 21 years of age or older.
- 4. Alcohol, illegal drugs, fireworks, and firearms (except by permission) are not permitted.
- 5. Groups must check in with the CAMPMASTER before starting to set up camp. He will have a key for buildings. Camporee or Event Chairpersons are also to report to the CAMPMASTER upon arrival.
- 6. Adult leader should check in with the CAMPMASTER on appropriate fire precautions. No open flames in tents.
- 7. Adult leader is expected to review these policies with all campers before arrival in camp.
- 8. All vehicles must be parked in the area designated by the CAMPMASTER. No vehicles are to be parked in the camping area.
- 9. Grounds and buildings must be left in clean condition to the satisfaction of the CAMPMASTER. The CAMPMASTER must inspect the camping area and complete the inspection form before the group leaves camp.
- 10. Checkout time is 10:00 a.m. Sunday.
- 11. No living trees are to be cut or damaged.
- 12. Group is expected to bring plastic bags and remove ALL trash from camp.
- 13. Group is encouraged to arrange with the CAMPMASTER to perform a camp "Good Turn" while in camp.
- 14. The rules governing the use of Ruth Rhoda Lake at Camp Conestoga and other program areas are:
 - a. No swimming at anytime.
 - b. Fishing is allowed by camping groups according to Pennsylvania Fish Commission Laws.
 - c. Canoeing and row boating is not available for weekend camping.
 - d. Archery and rifle ranges may be used with the prior special permission and with a properly certified instructor in charge.
- 15. Damage to camp facilities must be reported to the CAMPMASTER and the group will be expected to pay the costs of repair/replacement.
- 16. Where it applies, the group is expected to leave an adequate wood supply for the next group.
- 17. In the event of Unit cancellation Units are required to notify the CAMPMASTER and the Council Service Center no later than Wednesday of the week you are scheduled.
- 18. Pack Camping is considered family camping and must have at least one adult supervising each family. Camp only at approved pack camping site; (Eberly S. R. is approved). No winter camping between October 15th and April 1st. Pack must have a Baloo-trained person in charge at the overnight camp. See Cub Pack Overnight Regulations for more information.
