## Frequently Asked Questions from the Virtual Camp Kickoffs

- 1. Where can I find the Leader's Guides and other camp informational materials?
  - a. All camp materials can be found on our website at <u>www.wfbsa.org/camping</u>. For any items specific to COVID-19 and camp operations can be found at <u>https://wfbsa.org/camping/camp-covid-19/</u>
- 2. Will masks be required at camp?
  - a. In accordance with state and CDC guidelines, masks will be required at camp in any form of indoor setting and where social distancing of at least 6 feet is not possible. This will be monitored and enforced in all camp operated areas (program areas, dining hall, trading post, etc.) by the camp staff and administration. All unit areas (campsites, showerhouses, etc.) will be monitored and policed by the unit leadership.
- 3. If we paid our \$25 site fee last year but did not attend camp. Do we have to pay that again?
  - a. If your unit did not attend camp in 2020, the \$25.00 site reservation fee will need to be paid again when reserving a site.
- 4. How will meals be handled this coming year?
  - a. Meals will be served within the guidelines permitted under state and CDC restrictions. The camps initial meal plans are as follows:
    - i. Camp Conestoga- Breakfast will be served cafeteria style in the Robinson Dining Hall during a specific time window which is to be determined at a later time. Lunch will be served as it was in 2020 where units will send representatives to the Dining Hall to pick up their food. The meal will then be taken back to the unit campsite and served and consumed there. Dinner will be served in camps traditional fashion of family style, pending lifted restrictions.
    - Camp Buck Run- All meals will be served cafeteria style during designated times which will be announced at a later date. Units will be provided with 2-3 location options for eating to maximize social distancing.
- 5. What are the new Merit Badges coming to Conestoga in 2021?

- 6. Will Units be responsible for bringing contactless thermometers to monitor daily temperatures?
  - *a.* Yes, each unit will be required to bring at least one contactless thermometer with them to camp to check their participants temperature each day. The log form will be supplied by the camps.
- 7. Will Anything that Floats be returning in 2021?
  - *a.* Unfortunately, Anything That Floats will not be returning for the summer of 2021. Discussions are currently taking place for revitalizing the event for 2022.
- 8. Will there be Opening and Closing Campfires?
  - a. There will be opening and closing campfires at camp for 2021. Their location and format will be determined at a later date in order to reflect practices required by state and CDC guidelines.
- 9. Will the pool be open?
  - *a.* The pool will be open in 2021 as long as it is permitted by the state and any required restrictions can be adhered to.
- 10. If someone was unable to go through the Pathfinder program last year can they do it this year?
  - a. Yes! Any scout that missed out on the Pathfinder program in 2020 is able to sign up for it in 2021.
- 11. What will be the procedure is a Scout's temperature is found above the limit during the daily unit check?
  - a. The Scout should be immediately isolated, and their temperature should be rechecked after 10 minutes to ensure that it is not a false reading. If the temperature remains over the 100.4 limit it must be immediately reported to the camp health office for further direction.
- 12. How are medical forms being handled this year?
  - *a.* At the present time there has been not communication from national regarding any altered requirements for medical forms in the year of 2021. At the present time, the standard policies regarding the Annual Medical Health History must be followed. Anyone staying at camp for more than 72 hours must have a current medical form with parts A, B, & C completed which includes a doctor signature.
