# Camp Programs


Our primary summer camping facility is Eberly Scout Reservation (ESR) in Somerset, PA.

Camp Conestoga is one facility located within ESR and is the home of the council's Scouts BSA Resident Camp which operated five sessions last summer. Camp Conestoga was available for individual units to use for camping between September & November.

Camp Buck Run is the second facility located within ESR and is the home of the council's Cub Scout Resident Camp which operated five sessions last summer. Buck Run was also available for individual unit camping and council operated training events.

Camp Tenacharison is located in Smithton, PA and serves as the council's short term camping property for unit rental and council training events.

# Featured Eagle Scouts

A dedication ceremony for this memorial was held for the community last fall. Lachlan is a senior at The Kiski School where is a prefect and member of the swim team. He plans to study Aero-

> space Engineering after graduating high school this year.

Darius Colangelo earned his Eagle Scout Award in 2022 in Troop 205. For his project, Darius partnered with the Westmoreland Conservancy to construct a chimney swift tower at the McGinnis Nature Reserve in Murrysville, PA. This tower

serves as both a habitat for the endangered chimney swift and an informational kiosk for hikers along the trail. In addition to his troop service, Darius is an active member of the OA, serving as a lodge officer in 2022. Darius is a senior at Franklin Regional and plans to attend Notre Dame to study Chemical Engineering this fall.



Austin Sova became an Eagle Scout in 2022 as a member of Troop 620. For his project, Austin

reconstructed a raised masonry platform on which a Mother Mary statue was placed looking out over the horizon of St. Mary's Cemetery in Uniontown, PA. 
Virginia University where he is District studying Aerospace Engineering.



# Grants and Foundational Support

#### Katherine Mabis McKenna Foundation

The funding provided by the Katherine Mabis McKenna Foundation was used to purchase 23 new tents for Eberly Scout Reservation to support an initiative to phase out worn and tattered tents.

### **Madeline Nichols Memorial Fund**

The funding provided by the Madeline Nichols Memorial Fund was used to repair the perimeter fence of the Archery Range at Camp Conestoga and to begin building a collection of programmatic resources that can be used by local units to enhance recruitment efforts.

The funding provided by the C.B. Hollingsworth Trust was used to purchase the materials needed to replace three medium to large sized roofs on council properties. The roofs on Rice Lodge and Scruggs Pavilion were replaced by a group of the council's key maintenance volunteers. The Camp Conestoga Trading Post is scheduled to be replaced in the spring of 2023.
